

### AUDITORIUM

We have a magnificent auditorium which has a seating capacity of 500 persons. It is equipped with many modern facilities like ACs, generator, sound system etc. Seminars, symposiums, extension lectures and student functions are held here regularly.

### LIBRARY

The Islamic Centre has a spacious library with a rich collection on Tafsir, Hadith, Sirat-un-Nabi (SAWW), Fiqh, Tasawuf, Economics, Political Science, Sociology, Computer Science, General Knowledge, English Literature and other related disciplines

It has a collection of over 15,000 books. The library has latest computers with an access to digital libraries worldwide. This is to facilitate our students and scholars.

### HOSTEL (FOR BOYS ONLY)

Our hostel has a capacity to house more than 200 students. The hostel building lies adjacent to the main campus building. All the required facilities like TV Room, Table Tennis Room, Lecture Room, Discussion/Study Room, a Badminton Court, Generator (to provide uninterrupted supply of electricity for study) are available to the residents of the hostel.

Our hostel is a home from home. Resident Warden and Assistant Warden along with Staff and student proctors and para staff endeavor to keep the hostel environment conducive for studies and well-disciplined. It may be noted that the students of BS (CS) or other self-finance study programs are not entitled to seek residence in the hostel. However, they may be given admission in hostel provided there is accommodation. The

administration may cancel the admission of any student found involved in drugs or on any breach of discipline without any prior notice.

The facility of generator is available. It is availed as per budgetary provisions of the Centre.

All students seeking admission in the hostel are required to give the affidavit (on a stamp paper of value 100 rupee). The sample is given at the end.

### MASJID

Shaykh Zayed Islamic Centre, Peshawar has a beautiful Masjid with a capacity of 400 persons. A full time Pesh Imam Sahib and Mua'zin are present in the masjid for guidance to our students. The Centre's masjid is a Jamia masjid. The Jummah and Taraweeh prayers are attended by a great number of people regularly. Our masjid also holds Tarjuma, Nazira, and Tajweed Classes in the afternoon.

### PLAYGROUNDS & LAWNS

The Centre has a well-maintained playground and spacious lawns. Student matches of cricket, football, volleyball, table tennis and badminton are regularly held in the playground. The lawns add to the beauty and ambience of the exterior look of the Centre.

### RESIDENTIAL COLONY

The Center has a residential colony for its faculty and staff. There is an A-Type, 4 B-Type, 10 C-Type and 6 D-Type quarters. The in-house presence of staff and faculty makes a will knit community with the hostel resident students.



### Introduction


- BS in ISLAMIC STUDIES with ICT

This integration of Computer Science to Islamic and Arabic Studies is imperative to face new realities and future challenges and will make the modern research sources accessible for the students of Islamic and Arabic studies.


- In this regard the Islamic Centre offers a full time B.S 4 Years Program in Islamic Studies with Information and Communication Technologies for the New academic year of 2017 and a detailed scheme of study has been proposed by the (CRC) Curriculum Review Committee of the Islamic Centre
- Admission to BS (Islamic Studies) programme will be open to candidates who have passed F.A/F.Sc from BISE Peshawar or any other recognized Board, securing at least 45% marks.

- Students stemming out of five HEC recognized Madaris Boards (Tanzeemat al-Wifaq) with Khassah certificate duly attested from Inter Board Committee of Chairmen (IBCC) and scoring at least 50% marks will also be eligible for admission into BS Islamic Studies.

**Note:** (Non credit hours courses of English and Pak studies of intermediate level to be taught to students having Khassah certificate as compulsory subject).

A candidate who has completed one professional stream will not be eligible for admission to BS (Islamic Studies).

# Ph.D Islamic Studies (Religion & Theology)

Ph. D in Islamic Studies is the highest research degree awarded at Shaykh Zayed Islamic Centre, Peshawar. The program combines intensive and extensive studies in Islamic Disciplines with a research work at an advanced level. An in-depth study of classical Muslim knowledge tradition and comparative religion studies constitute the core of the program.The program ensures that students interact directly with original sources in Arabic and Urdu. Training scholars in this way can contribute quality research to the discipline in modern perspective, which is the prime goal of this program.

MS/Mphil with a minimum of 3.0 CGPA required. Candidate must have passed GAT Test conducted by NTS with at least 60% Marks.






## Affidavit
